General Information

The School Sport Victoria (SSV) Team Vic representative program provides a development platform for The School Sport V clona (SSV) learn Vic depresentative program provides a development blattorm for victorian stucents to challenge themselves against Australia's best school aged othetes across numerous sports at the annuel School Sport Australia (SSA) Championships. SSV coordinate the selection process for Team Vic teams in orthership with relevant state sporting organisations. Desending on the sport and team, the selection process involves either: Progressive or conference model. State trial/s

- Results from event/s
- Based on rankings/results or talent identification program

- To be eligible for selection, students must: be a full-time student that attends school regularly with a School Sport Victoria member school, have their selection endorsed by their school Principal; be available to ottend selection triols and training sessions; and
- meet the costs of participation

Students registering for trials are indicating that they will be available for all stages of the trial process. For information on the sports and teams participating in the SSA Championships, please refer to the individual Team Vic sport pages on the SSV website

REGISTRATIONS

All students must register to trial for Team Vic via the Game Day registration link on each Team Vic sport. page.

The registration dates for each sport can be found on the Team Vic Sport and Registrations Key Dates

- note the following: There is no late registration period for any sport in 2024. It is the responsibility of the student/parent/carer, to check the <u>SSV website</u> for opening and closing dates for registrations the closing dates will differ for each team. registration confirmation will come from GameDay and net SSV.

CONDUCT

Both <u>SSV</u> and <u>SSA</u> have Coces of Conduct to ensure a positive, enjoyable and fair trial process and Championship events. It is imperative that all participants are familiar with these expectations as well as the consequences of breaching the codes prior to participating in the trials or in Championship events.

PARTICIPATION COSTS

Participation in SSV Team Vic representative teams is fully self-tunded, so students will be required to me the costs of being a member of a team. Such costs include host state and administration levies, uniform, transport, accommodation, and meals.

SSV can provide some indicative costs to help families budget and meet the costs of participation. The cost of the SSA Championships nost state and administration levies and SSV Team Vic uniform is approximately \$1000 per student.

However, the total participation cost can vary greatly, depending upon the location, travel options, timing of the SSA Championship and when travel and accommodation bookings are made. These are outside of SSV's contro

Please note, a parent/caren is required to travel with their child to the SSA Championship in 2024 and be primarily responsible for the supervision of their child outside of official SSA Championship activities.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Information regarding the various financial support options available can be found on the Einancial Assistance page on the SSV website.

The main fundraising approach available to families is the Australian Sports Foundation, which provides an online platform to assist with the costs of participating in the SSA Championships.

TEAM VIC SELECTION PROCESS

The trial list will be notified as to whether they have progressed to the next selection stage generally within a week of the trial(s) concluding. If it has been more than a week and you have not received notification, please contact SSV

Team Vic teams will be announced via the SSV website generally within a week of the conclusion of the Team Vic trial


