Anxiety, worries and fears in children

ANXIETY IS NORMAI

Anxiety, worries and fear: a natural part of childhood.

Anxiety is the feeling of worry or fear that something bad is going to happen. It's also the physical reactions that go with the feeling, like 'butterflies in the stomach'.and it's associated behaviour like avoiding what's causing the anxiety or wanting a lot of reassurance.

Anxiety, worry and fear are natural emotions.

It's common for children to feel anxious, worried or afraid. In most cases, these feelings come and go and don't last long. In fact, different anxieties, fears, and worries often develop at different stages of development.

WHAT ARE KIDS ANXIOUS ABOUT?

<u>Babies and toddlers</u> are often anxious about separation from you. They also fear things like loud noises, heights and strangers. But babies and toddlers don't tend to worry in the way that older children do.

<u>Preschoolers</u> might start to show fear of being on their own and of the dark. But worry still isn't common in this age group. If preschoolers do worry, it tends to be about things like getting sick or hurt.

School-age children might be afraid of supernatural things like ghosts, social situations, criticism, tests and physical harm or threat. Children over 8 years of age might worry about things like failure at sport or school, war, pandemics, the environment, family relationships and so on.

HOW TO SUPPORT CHILDREN WITH ANXIETY

If you think your child is showing signs of typical childhood anxiety, worries or fears, you can support them in several ways:

- Acknowledge your child's fear or worry, and let them know that most children feel anxious sometimes.
- Talk with your child about their worries.
- Gently encourage and support your child to face situations they're anxious about.
- Wait until your child gets anxious before you step in to help.
- Praise your child for doing something they're anxious about

- Avoid criticising your child for being afraid or worried.
- Avoid labelling your child as 'shy' or 'anxious'.
- Make sure your child eats <u>healthy food</u>, does enough <u>physical activity</u> and gets the <u>sleep</u> they need. Good physical health is important for mental health.

Did you know? The

stepladder approach is a stepby-step way of helping children and teenagers handle anxiety.

- The approach involves tackling little things before facing really scary things.
- The approach encourages children and teenagers to face their fears, rather than avoiding them.
- You can use the approach for different ages and anxieties.

THE STEP LADDER APPROACH FOR A 7 YEAR OLD

Example of the stepladder approach for a 7-year-old with separation anxiety.

This child has <u>separation anxiety</u>. They're afraid of leaving their mother, even for a short time. At the start of the stepladder, this child can't sleep alone and sleeps in their parents' bed.

Here's a stepladder for this child:

- 1. They stay inside and play while Mum puts the washing on the line.
- 2. They stay in their bedroom and play for 30 minutes while Mum is in a different room.
- They stay at home with Dad while Mum visits the neighbour for 10 minutes.
- They sleep on a mattress on the floor, next to Mum and Dad's bed.
- 5. They stay at home with Dad while Mum goes shopping for 30 minutes.
- 6. They stay at home with Dad while Mum goes out to lunch.
- 7. They sleep on the mattress on the floor but move it closer to the door, away from Mum and Dad's bed.
- 8. They stay at home with another trusted adult while Mum and Dad go out for lunch.
- 9. They stay at home with Dad while Mum goes out for the evening.
- 10. They stay at home with another trusted adult while Mum and Dad go out for the evening.
- 11. They sleep in their own bedroom.
- 12. They stay at home with another trusted adult and sleep in their own bedroom while Mum and Dad go out for the evening.

If you're unsure about how to do this, consider talking to a professional – perhaps a child and a sychologist or contact the school.




